

Filming. Videoing, Photography and Audio Recording at Council Meetings policy.

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The Council, members of the public and the press may record / film / photograph or broadcast this meeting when the press and the public are not lawfully excluded.

Any member of the public who attends a meeting and objects to being filmed should advise the Clerk (in advance) who will instruct that they are not to be included in the filming. Members of the public speaking at or attending the meeting must not be filmed if they have indicated that they do not wish to be included.

Recording and reporting of the Council's meetings is subject to the law and it is the responsibility of those doing the recording and reporting to ensure compliance. This will include the Human Rights Act, Data Protection Act and the laws of libel and defamation. The Chairman of the meeting will have absolute discretion to terminate or suspend any of the above activities if, in his / her opinion, continuing to do so would prejudice the ruining of the meeting.

Recording may only take place at the points indicated in the plan below.
